Dear Parents,



Enrolments

Traffic and Parking in a School Zone

Together with council regulations in surrounding areas the Staff Car park is **not** accessible to cars during drop off and pick up times. Please only use the drop off zone in the mornings to "kiss and drop" your child. It is not appropriate to enter the car park to park the car and walk students into school.

Attendance

There are many ways families can support their children to be prepared for learning at school. For example,

- by making school attendance a high priority in your family;
- · by ensuring children get enough sleep,
- a good diet and regular exercise;
- by encouraging reading from an early age;
- by sharing the learning journey through an active involvement in your child's school, hobbies and extra-curricular activities, and so on.

Of course, in order for students to learn at school, they need to be at school. In fact, it is illegal for school-aged children not to attend school. Even more troubling though, is the learning a child will miss if they do not attend school. If a student misses as little as eight days each term, by the end of primary school they will have missed over a year of learning.
