FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents & Friends,

Last week I was provided with the opportunity to participate in a Conference for educators in "Presentation Schools". The Conference theme was based on a line from Luke's Gospel:

"I have come to cast fire upon the earth..." Luke 12:4



As you know the foundations of our school community have been formed from the Presentation Sisters Charism and the work of their foundress, Nano Nagle. Formed in 18th century Cork Islands, the sisters began an order that would become worldwide in their influence.

This Charism is a gift of the Holy Spirit to an individual for the good of others.

The Presentation Sisters grew from this Charism with a great dedication and passion for those made poor and worked to ensure changing those structures that kept those people in their state of poverty.

For the Presentation Sisters the answer to tearing down these structures was in educating the poor, working tirelessly for the marginalised.

For Nano Nagle, following Jesus, whose identification with those made poor and those oppressed, was so strong and unambiguous that it led to his death, would become the driving force and the light that would eventually touch the lives of millions.

Nothing Exists Apart from God

What do you know for certain? The question, posed by a friend, was challenging, and answering wasn't as easy as I'd thought. There are many things I believe. Things I hope. Things I've been taught. But what do I know for certain?

Even the darkness is held by light. I scratched the words onto a page and looked at them. Even the darkness is held by light. Yes, I know this most of all. There is no corner of creation, no event, no circumstance where God is not. There is no life, period, apart from the Spirit. In my own most penetrating darkness, my husband and daughter senselessly killed, still...there was light. Whether or not I saw it, whether or not I believed...light penetrated my life. God is found in the depths of both the light and the dark.

Lent reminds me of this deeper knowing: The universe is ordered to God. And I must learn to see beyond passing disappointments and accept the exquisite timing of creation and of my own journey. Where I listen to life from is crucial. From ego, the gratification of my own needs and satisfactions takes over. From ego, my circumstances dominate, and the dark appears to be separate from God.

But looking from the spirit within, I know differently. I know that everything unfolds in its time. I know that within all adversity is a force of love that prevails. I am safe, even in the dark.

POPULAR ANZAC BISCUIT RECIPE

The popular ANZAC biscuit is a traditional, eggless sweet biscuit.

The following is a original recipe provided by Bob Lawson, an ANZAC present at the Gallipoli landing.

Ingredients:-

- 1 cup each of plain flour, sugar, rolled oats, and coconut
- 4 oz butter
- 1 tbs treacle (golden syrup)
- 2 tbs boiling water
- 1 tsp bicarbonate soda (add a little more water if mixture is too dry)

Method:-

1. Grease biscuit tray and pre-heat oven to 180°C.
2. Combine dry ingredients.
3. Melt together butter and golden syrup. Combine water and bicarbonate soda, and add to butter mixture.
4. Mix butter mixture and dry ingredients.
5. Drop teaspoons of mixture onto tray, allowing room for spreading.
6. Bake for 10 to 15 minutes or until golden. Allow to cool on tray for a few minutes before transferring to cooling racks.
