Dear 'Presentation' Parents and Friends,




### FROM THE LIBRARY

## ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT



### Dear Parents and Friends,

We are half way through the term and we are still having a strong focus on improving reading comprehension and multiplicative thinking. So, how can you help your child?

### Don't leave home without it

Bring along a book or magazine any time your child has to wait, such as at a doctor's office. Always try to fit in reading!

### Once is not enough

Encourage your child to re-read favorite books and poems. Re-reading helps kids read more quickly and accurately.

### Dig deeper into the story

Ask your child questions about the story you've just read. Say something like, "Why do you think Clifford did that?"

### Take control of the television

It's difficult for reading to compete with TV and video games. Encourage reading as a free-time activity.

### Be patient

When your child is trying to sound out an unfamiliar word, give him or her time to do so. Remind to child to look closely at the first letter or letters of the word.

### Pick books that are at the right level

Help your child pick books that are not too difficult and not too easy. The aim is to give your child lots of successful reading experiences.

### Play word games

Have your child sound out the word as you change it from mat to fat to sat; from sat to sag to sap; and from sap to sip.

### I read to you, you read to me

Take turns reading aloud at bedtime. Kids enjoy this special time with their parents.

### Gently correct your young reader

When your child makes a mistake, gently point out the letters he or she overlooked or read incorrectly. Many beginning readers will guess wildly at a word based on its first letter.

### Talk, talk, talk!

Talk with your child every day about school and things going on around the house. Sprinkle some interesting words into the conversation, and build on words you've talked about in the past.

### Write, write, write!

Ask your child to help you write out the grocery list, a thank you note to Grandma, or to keep a journal of special things that happen at home. When writing, encourage your child to use the letter and sound patterns he is learning at school.

Our children need many opportunities to read and need to be exposed to different types of books. The local library is a great place to start! Start thinking about ensuring reading continues into the holidays....books are a great Christmas gift.

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### MISSION





Mrs Coope (our teacher) introduced the topic of 'Mission: Witnessing and Proclaiming Jesus throughout the World' during a Religion Unit. We watched two videos that inspired us to make a difference. The two videos were called 'Ryan's Well' and 'Catholic Mission in Peru'. Ryan raised \$2000 to provide fresh water in a well in Africa. The Catholic Mission in Peru video was demonstrating what it would be like living in a third world country and how Catholic Mission helps. We compared their life to ours and realised that is wasn't right.

We decided to raise money to buy resources for those in need across the world. At first it was hard to decide our goal but we came to the decision that we would raise 500 dollars. In the first few weeks we raised over 100 dollars in our class 5C, which gave us hope to raise more money. To raise more money we set up a stall which had lollies, stationary, chips and bracelets. With that money we raised five hundred and nineteen dollars and twenty five cents. In total we have raised about \$1100 because our classroom teacher (Mrs Coope) and our drama literacy teacher (Mr Martin) will match how much we have raised. With this money, we will buy animals, back to school kits and wheelchairs for families in need. We hope that we can make a difference together!
