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From the Principal

Dear Parents and Friends,

Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son....' Dear Presentation People, what else do we need to know.

What our Bishop says, "as a Church, we must die to the old ways of being Church which are steeped in a culture of clerical power, dominance and privilege....the new paradigm is one based on **mutuality** not exclusion, **love** not fear, **service** not clericalism, **engagement** with the world not flight from or hostility against it, **incarnate grace** not dualism."

In speaking with Father Peter about our changing enrolment patterns he agreed with me that our School Community reflects the changing nature of our Church. Fr Peter this week wrote, "As we engage in change and face a future which will demand change, we need to model our relating on the mutuality of the heart of a God who LOVES, and so discern how to best to be (Church/ School) in what is clearly a changing world."

Dear Presentation Brothers and Sisters this changing world will demand of us a firm belief of who we are and what we believe. You have all come to us believing in the One God, and with a strong commitment to "Loving One Another."

Dear Friends, over the next couple of weeks we all will be preparing for our parent/teacher interviews. I am hoping for 100% of all families working with their children's teachers. I have invited our teachers to:

- Back their professional judgement.
- Bring to your discussions a professional understanding of your children's achievements/needs supported by data, work samples and story.
- Invite parents feedback and be open to listening and learning.
- Set an action plan, talk about new goals, speak of where to next.

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RE News

Next Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, also known as *Corpus Christi*, this celebrates and commemorates the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. In the Gospel Jesus repeatedly asks that his followers eat his flesh and drink his blood. It is through these actions that his followers will share in eternal life. Jesus says that whoever



does this will live in him and he will live in them. That is one of the fundamental beliefs about the Eucharist. When we receive the body and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist we become what we receive – we become Christ's body in the world. When Jesus called his disciples, he called them to be like himself. He reissues that call to be like him every time we receive his body and blood in Eucharist this is how we become PRESENTATION PEOPLE.

Meals are very important events. Not only do we physically need food and drink to keep ourselves alive, but we use meals to mark occasions and celebrate events: birthdays; weddings; dates; achievements; disappointments; reunions. There is a sacredness about gathering with friends and family and sharing a meal together. Stories are told; memories shared; the food is appreciated and more often than not there's a drink to accompany the meal. Treating such occasions with gratitude – as blessed moments of grace – is living out the Eucharistic reality of welcoming Jesus into our lives and seeking to be more like him.



Friday 23rd June we will celebrate the Feast of Sacred Heart of Jesus with a whole school Mass at 9.30am in the Church. Please feel most welcome to attend.

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School Reports

As you are aware, reports will be sent home next week. In determining overall achievements of students, teachers have assessed students using a variety of assessment tools. The results from these assessments allow teachers to make balanced, professional judgement. Tasks include formal assessment activities such as tests, projects and presentations and informal assessment opportunities that include observations, checklists and discussions. Teachers make consistent and reliable judgement about the students work, taking into account the student's knowledge, skills and understandings up to this point in the year. The allocation of A-E depends on the level of achievement.

To put the A-E reporting system into perspective, it helps to look at the analogy below for driving a car.

School reports can be challenging times for parents and students. The students take their cues from your reaction and this will affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people. Here are some questions to consider...

- Do you feel comfortable with the A-E grading scale, and understand that it is very different from the 'old' style that you had at school?
- Are your expectations for your child in line with their abilities?
- Do you hold the belief that all children learn at different rates?
- Are you willing to safeguard your child's self esteem rather than deflate it?
- Have you considered your child's work habits and effort rating? Remember to praise effort, not just results
- Have you spent time talking to your child about how they learn?
