Dear Parents and Friends,

This week's Gospel reading is the story of Jesus meeting the Samaritan woman at the well. This story holds a great message for all of us. The Samaritan woman was forced by her culture and community to visit the well in the heat of the day. This woman was an outcast not regarded as a fit person and so her life was lived on the margins.

In seeing the woman Jesus asked for her to share some water.

Immediately Jesus is inviting this woman 'in', he accepts and offers a great gift.

"Jesus said to the Samaritan woman,

whoever drinks this water will get thirsty again:

but anyone who drinks the water I shall give

will never be thirsty again:

the water I shall give will turn into a spring inside

welling up to eternal life."

"Sir said the woman, 'Give me some of that water.' John 4

SMS DAILY ABSENCES

We have now started using the Daily Absence SMS system. If your child is absent from school you will receive an SMS message in the morning. We ask that you reply to this SMS promptly stating very briefly why your child is absent from school eg. Mary is sick etc.—please also **do not** use any symbols (ie. smiley faces, \$ % & ()in your text reply as it creates an error. The majority of SMS messages are sent to one of the parents only. Once you have replied to an SMS you do not need to send a note as this reply is uploaded into your child's attendance record.

PLEASE NOTE: If you are aware that your child is going to be absent for any length of time, could you please write a note to the teacher explaining absence. For leave over 10 days during the school term you will need to complete an "Application for Extended Leave (L) - Travel".


















Programs
