From the Principal

Dear Parents and Friends:

What a brilliant celebration of womanhood and motherhood we had on Friday. I couldn't help advocating my belief that our world and its future requires not just the wisdom of women but also their compassion and empathy.



On this special day, I thought it might be of interest to return to the *Presentation* Conference, 'One Step Beyond.' Sir. Joyce Meyer was our first keynote speaker and shared her work around, 'Crossing Borders to Global Citizenship.' I'd like to share one aspect of her thinking around Transformation. I found it interesting to consider her interpretation of Christ's Transformation during his life, interestingly two of these major moments were during his interaction with two women very much living on the margins.

The "Wedding at Cana", and 'The Woman at the Well,' provide Jesus with the opportunity to transform, for as Rohr believes, "Transformation is to look on love and be whole." In both encounters the women and their situations challenge Jesus. At the wedding the woman in asking for her child to be healed, is challenging Jesus to include all, to save all. And at the well, Jesus is drawn into a woman's life and through the encounter with a person who is so different, Jesus allows himself to accept and love to be open to transformation.

When you consider your life, when have been your moments of transformation?

Once again our friend Fr. Richard Rohr suggest, "Waking up (transformation) occurs in a place where great love meets great suffering." I believe transformation is this journey we are all on in acknowledging our Spiritual beginnings and in becoming **fully human**. If we take the lead from Jesus this transformation will be in

our encounter with and acceptance of all as we, "Love One Another".


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
RE News
