

Pat-R Reading Assessment Results

Over the course of Week 10 Term 3 and Week 1 of Term 4 students across grades 2 – 6 completed the annual PAT-R reading comprehension assessment. PAT stands for Progressive Achievement Test and R for Reading. This assessment is a thoroughly researched and normed test for measuring and tracking student achievement in reading comprehension, word knowledge and spelling. It provides our *teachers* with objective information for setting realistic learning goals and planning effective literacy programs as result of student achievement.

In 2016, we set our school community a number of goals to achieve in Formation, Numeracy and Literacy. This year's literacy goal is for 90% of students to read at or above grade level as measured by the DEC continuum, PAT-R- Grade Scale Score and "Diocesan Reading Profiles". After an analysis of all data (test results) from this year's PAT-R reading comprehension assessment, I am very pleased to present that **over 85%** of students have obtained a reading Scale Score at or above expected grade level. Yes, we are 5% short of our target. However this result is a HUGE achievement and some of the best results we as a school community have achieved since the inception of this assessment.

The progress we continue to make in ensuring our students comprehend what they are reading would not be possible if not for the professionalism of our teachers and the reading support you afford your children at home. Hours of professional development, cooperative planning, assessment, data analysis, reporting and strategic leadership with a clear focus, go into achieving these results. I would like to thank those families who take the time to contact the school to express their thanks for all the work our teachers do to maximise their child's potential. As I have previously mentioned in past newsletters, the positive partnership between the home and the school has a direct impact on student achievement, with this in mind I would like to thank you as parents and caregivers for your support.

SCHOOL SUMMER UNIFORM

Thank you to those families who have ensured their children returned to school this term in the correct uniform. Our school uniform is a symbol of our entire school community. Parents are urged to ensure that the children come to school in the correct uniform, worn appropriately. When you are purchasing sports shoes for your children the school uniform code is for a 'predominately white shoe'.

At St Michael's we have a "no hat no play" rule. Children who do not have a hat will not be able to play at recess or lunchtime and must sit in the shade.

Hair: Hairstyles should be appropriate to the school setting, e.g. extreme colours or cuts are not permitted.

Girls: Shoulder length hair or longer must be tied back with a navy blue scrunchie/hair elastic.

Boys: Hair should be collar length and neatly trimmed.

God surrounds us each moment of our lives. Jesus, in last week's Gospel, told his disciples to recognise that and rejoice. We all want close friends willing to hang out with us. Some of us have them. Some don't. But we all have a best friend in God, who is always there trying to shape us, help us, respond to us.

Here's a challenge. Pray always, or without ceasing, this week. Make an effort to remember that God walks with you at all times, down every road, through every shopping centre, and across every street. Talk and listen to God throughout the day. In other words, just hang out together.

Does this teaching about the need for prayer mean that God needs to be convinced of our cause? Does a one-off prayer not get heard? Is God swayed by the force of numbers? Can the prayers of ten people carry more weight than the prayers of one? All these questions miss the point of the parable. It is not God who needs our prayers, but we who have to recognise, through prayer, our need for God's mercy and gracious love. The constancy of prayer is not to convince God but to remind ourselves of our dependence upon God.

Parramatta Diocesan Summer Sport Trials

ATTENTION TO STUDENTS IN YEARS 4 AND 5 IN 2016

Each year students who play particular sports at a very competitive level have the opportunity to trial for Parramatta Diocese Representative teams. The process is first to complete an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST, please ensure you the parent or carer completes this process and you MUST SUBMIT the form. You should receive a confirmation email if your submission was successful.

The summer sports that have opened the nomination process are BASKETBALL, SOFTBALL, TENNIS AND CRICKET. NOTE: Winter sport trial nominations will NOT OPEN until later in the year.

The expression of interest for winter sports closes on FRIDAY 28th October (week 3).

2017 Parramatta Diocesan—Team Sport Trials

Any Primary students enrolled in Parramatta Diocesan Schools in Year 5 and 6 in 2017 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four of 2016 (Summer Sports - Basketball, Cricket, Softball & Tennis) and Term One/Two in 2017 (Winter Sports - AFL, Football, Hockey, Netball, Rugby League League, Rugby Union & Touch).

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2017 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials in 2017 will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), & Touch (B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website

www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au.This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2017 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY and MUST be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

Please ensure that the SUBMIT button has been pressed upon completing the form and notification email will be sent to the parent/guardian listed on the form confirming this expression of interest has been received.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the

trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

**Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Summer Sports Registrations close Friday 28th October 5pm. Winter Sports Registrations close Friday 3rd February 5pm.
