
RE News

Jesus often used stories to explain something important. In next Sunday's gospel, Jesus used the example of seating at a wedding to teach his followers something about being humble. Jesus was at the home of a leading Pharisee and he saw that the guests were all trying to get the best seats. And so he told them a story about guests at a wedding.

He asked them to imagine how it would feel if, when a guest came to the wedding, they sat at the best place. Then later, someone came up to them and asked them to move to make room for someone more important. Jesus said it was better if that person had chosen a different seat, and been asked by the host to move to a better one.

Jesus also told them (and us) that they should not just show care for those we like or love, but should be concerned about people that others neglect. He promised that God would reward us.

This is particularly relevant as we celebrate the Year of Mercy with the Cross of Mercy and Relics being at St Michael's and in Mary, Queen of the Family Parish over the last few days. How are we the Face of Mercy to others? By others we don't mean just the people we like and love but all people. All the people we encounter should be shown the mercy of God's love through our interactions with them.

Going on pilgrimage with the 300 pilgrims of our Diocese in Parramatta was an absolutely amazing experience! In Krakow we joined together with about 3000 other Australian pilgrims at our National gathering to kick off WYD week, and that was a huge boost of excitement and togetherness for



us. The arena floor was packed with people waving Aussie flags and wearing our green pilgrim t-shirts, coming together to celebrate our living faith.

But that was nothing compared to the events that would take place over the next week! The events held at Błonia Park in the city



were attended by around 1 000 000 people from all over the world! And the Final Prayer Vigil and Mass by about 2 000 000!!

The Thing that became obvious for me over these days of pilgrimage was that I am truly part of a universal church! I have millions of brothers and sisters all around the world who are living their faith everyday like me. That we are all connected by something far bigger than any differences we might find in our lives. We are connected by God who created us all and loves us each so much. We have to choose to live that love for each other as well, no matter what. As Pope Francis said to all those gathered: *"Peace builds bridges; hatred is the builder*



BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care.

It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools. This undertaking also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children. The links below replaces our school's (and diocese) previous "Child Protection Briefing training". We would request that all volunteers complete the forms below as soon as possible. 

Cyber Safety

The world of social media & technology is fast becoming the centre of our children's universe. It can be a challenging task for parents to stay on top of the dangers of social media and technology, while monitoring their child's online behaviour and finding balance.

Children think that the internet gives them privacy and a sense of control but the very opposite is true. It is the parents' responsibility to ensure they teach their child the dangers of the online world, just as they would teach them about dangers of the physical world. If you teach your child to avoid talking to strangers in the real world, than it is just as vital to teach them this rule in the cyber-world.

You may like to reflect on the following in regards to your family expectations for internet use:

- 1. Time limits.
- 2. What you can and can't say online.
- 3. Obscene language is not to be tolerated.
- 4. Allow only sites that you are comfortable with and avoid all social media platforms that offer anonymity, eg ask.fm, yikyak, tumblr, kick, instagram, secret etc as these are most dangerous for your child's physical and mental wellbeing.
- 5. Stick to the age requirements for all sites. It is not appropriate or legal for children under 13 to have a Facebook page.
- 6. Keep all devices out of bedrooms at night. Serious health and learning complications arise from the disturbed sleep caused by access to devices during the night.
- 7. Monitor and vet the games that your children are playing. Games intended for and rated 18 + are clearly adult games and should not be put in the hands of impressionable young children. It is up to the adults in their lives to take gaming under control for their children and check age ratings prior to purchase. 8. Online bullying through social media is a police matter. If parents suspect or know about inappropriate talk and conversations online involving their child it is YOUR responsibility to protect your child by intervening in an appropriate manner.
