### From the Principal

Dear Parents and Friends,

As we now are commencing our second semester, our work is to keep our 2016 Goals and strategies in clear focus.

### **Religious Education:**

In 2016, support growth of staff and students capacity to **interpret Gospel** at an inferential level and connect it to their daily interaction and prayer.

### Literacy:

In 2016—90% of students will increase their **reading comprehension** skills to be at or above grade level as measured by the DEC continuum, PatR-grade Scale sore and Diocesan Reading Profiles.

### **Numeracy:**

In 2016 with a focus on 'Rich Tasks' - 90% of students will progress at least 1 Growth Point across all domains and vulnerable children will have accelerated growth. This growth will be measured according to MAI data and syllabus outcomes. (This is all about **comprehending** the **problem.)** 

These Goals all have a focus on the building of *Comprehension Skills*. The 'symphony of skills' begin from day 1 in Kindergarten and continue throughout our student's learning journey.

### These skills include:

- Activating Prior knowledge
- Self-Monitoring
- Visualising
- Predicting
- Inferring
- Synthesizing
- Questioning
- Summarising



Success of all our goals will be supported by the 'whole village' approach. In other words your work at home will support our work at school. I invite you to support our work in building comprehension skills by:

Reading with and to your child each day

• Talking about the book, inviting your child to share their thoughts, insights and predictions.

- When reading through the book, take time to investigate unfamiliar words. Talk about these words, use them so as to reinforce their meaning.
- Use the book to talk about your experiences, the families and your child's.

Have fun in talking about all aspects of the book including, pictures, blurb, style and purpose.

### **SCHOOL SAFETY**

When you came to enroll your child at St Michael's you asked that we 'keep your child safe.' The safety and wellbeing of our students is a constant focus of our work.

In 2016 we are working at securing our school site. We need your continued support in following our 'kiss and drop' protocols.

**RE News** 



In today's gospel, Jesus provides his disciples, and all Christians, with a model for prayer. In keeping with this modelling by Jesus, it is significant that the Lord's Prayer, or Our Father, is the common prayer of all Christians, regardless of denomination.

The parable and teaching that follow the Lord's Prayer make clear the particular purpose of prayer that Jesus was highlighting – prayer as petition. In this instance, Jesus assures us that if we pray for what we need with conviction and confidence, then God cannot fail to respond to our prayer. Jesus in fact encourages us to be demanding and persistent in our prayer. However, the parable used to demonstrate the persistent nature of prayer is not focused on demands for selfish purposes, but rather the neighbour needs assistance in fulfilling his obligations of hospitality to a traveller. He is not waking his neighbour in the middle of the night to ask for bread for himself; he asks for bread to give to his guest. He asks for help to fulfil his duty and responsibility. This gives us something of an idea about how we might focus our prayer. Praying for a new car or new clothes just isn't quite in the same league!



### BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS AND CONTRACTORS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted. Your details are maintained confidentially in a central database and a copy of your confirmation is emailed to the location where you are contracting.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change
