Several years ago Hurricane Katrina flooded New Orleans. Hundreds died. Rescuers found hundreds trapped on rooftops. Some argued that many people suffered only because the government authorities weren't prepared for the storm.

As Advent begins this week, Jesus reminds us that people suffered in Noah's time because they weren't prepared.

Advent is a good season to think about that. As you do, prepare yourself for Christ.

Remember, Advent is also a season of hope. We light candles to remember that

Christ's power seeks to beat back the darkness of injustice every day.

Prepare yourself by looking for evidence of grace. To every war, God sends

peacemakers. Stay awake, Jesus says, and you'll see reasons for hope all over the world.

Prepare yourself to be grace and hope this season, the person who shines light by standing for peace, feeding the hungry, forgiving an enemy, or welcoming an outcast.

Sure, sadness floods our world, but God sends boats to the rescue. Jump on board this Advent. People stranded by pain and injustice are waiting for you.

Where can you make a difference at home, at school, at work, or in the world this Advent?

The Action

Slow down. While the rest of the world gets ready for Christmas by buying presents, hosting parties, baking, travelling and so on, you can prepare yourself for Christmas by setting your priorities straight. What are they? Try saying a mantra such as *'Come, Lord Jesus'* over and over for five minutes. Praying in this way helps calm us down and also makes us more open to God throughout the day. At the end of your day, try sitting and lighting a candle. Repeat Isaiah's words: *'Let us walk in the light of the Lord!'* As you light an additional candle each week, the light of Christ will get stronger and brighter. Don't let the busyness of December distract you from what is most important.



2017 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials



Any Primary students enrolled in Parramatta Diocesan Schools in Year 5 and 6 in 2017 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term One/Two in 2017 (Winter Sports - AFL, Football, Hockey, Netball, Rugby League League, Rugby Union & Touch).

It is **important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport.** While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2017 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials in 2017 will be held in the following sports: *AFL (boys), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website <u>www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au</u>.

This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2017 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST** be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

Please ensure that the **SUBMIT** button has been pressed upon completing the form and notification email will be sent to the parent/guardian listed on the form confirming this expression of interest has been received.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet. Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Winter Sports Registrations close Friday 3rd February 5pm.

School travel 2017 Application information Nov 2016

Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online process for you to submit school travel applications.

This means we will be able to process your applications online. making it easier and faster for parents. guardians and students to apply for school travel.

Applications for school travel in 2017 are now open. including for travel to Mascot and Green Square station and for private ferries. Parents. guardians and students are encouraged to apply as soon as they are able via:

Applications for 2017 school travel are now open via www.transportnsw.info/school-students

A new application is required when:

- applying for a School Opal card or travel pass for the first time.
- enrolling in Kindergarten. or
- requesting an additional entitlement as a result of a shared parental responsibility situation.

You will need to do an update application if the student has a current school travel pass and:

- is progressing from Year 2 to Year 3.
- is progressing from Year 6 to Year 7. or
- changes address. or
- changes school or campus.

Already have a School Opal card or travel pass?

- When you've updated. and you are eligible for free school travel next year. Transport for NSW will send you an email confirmation once your application has been processed. For travel in rural or regional NSW. we'll also inform your nominated transport operator(s).
- If you already have a School Opal card that does not need updating. or you've successfully re-applied. the Opal card will automatically be updated for travel next year. Do not throw it out as you'll be able to use it when the school year starts in 2017.
- If you currently have a printed travel pass provided by your transport operator. a new
 pass will be will be ready at the beginning of the new school year.
