I look forward to announcing our 2018 teaching teams in the coming weeks. I will continue my meetings with all members of staff over the next couple of days to share with them their teams for next year. The selection criteria was pretty simple, *where will our children most benefit from our talents and experiences?*

This week we will continue to confirm our 2018 PE position as well as short-listing our Coordinator 2 positions.



Last week I couldn't get over the energy and love of learning. Our year 4 team working with Ms Ferrari (CEDP), Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Pullen explored reading, comprehension, pedagogy and data analysis. Their work resulted not only in *deep learning* it also built a stronger *collaborative team*. That afternoon a large number of our team spent time working with *PatR Data* and *analysis*. When we add to the mix Mrs McKay's work with the 'Waterfall,' (*Assessment Framework*) and our work in planning our *2018 Action Plan* it's no wonder our love of learning is having such great effects on our *children's learning*.

Given our teaching teams feedback re (our strengths and challenges) **90% in the circle and 10% out**, one of our professional needs in supporting 'Learning for All children,' is around **Assessment**. What we are trying to achieve is an intensive focus on a high yielding element within our 'Learning Framework.' Over the next 2 weeks I will be publishing *draft goals* for your perusal and thinking.



Finally I want to thank all of you for accepting our invitation to last weeks Grandparent Liturgy. What a brilliant celebration of us living out our motto—
What a brilliant time in building community.



I RECENTLY launched a podcast series called *Blunderer Voices* where I chat to educators and educational leaders.

One of the first questions I always ask is "Which teacher inspired you most and why?" Without a pause, my guests can all name that teacher.

The qualities of those in-

spiring teachers are things like passion for the work, commitment to improving their teaching and always putting the students first. These are the hallmarks of great teachers.

When I look back on the teacher who most inspired me, it was Alan Drummond, who taught history. Alan was honest when we needed

to work harder, challenging when he knew we could do better and always encouraging.

He had a deep passion for European history, which, I have to admit, I didn't share as a 17-year-old. In the end, the effort (his and mine!) paid off.

When I received my HSC results, I was amazed to

learn that I was ranked 30th in the state for history. It was Alan's passion and expertise that not only influenced my exam results but my decision to become an English and history teacher.

Teaching is a demanding profession. It is also one of the most important professions in society, which is why we celebrate World Teachers Day on October 27.

World Teachers Day is an opportunity for the wider community to recognise the valuable contribution made by teachers everywhere. It is also an opportunity to pause and reflect on the impact

those great teachers had on us and our children.

When you drop your children at school on Friday or you take a break at work, encourage you to think about that one teacher who inspired you the most. Some times we get the opportunity to thank them in person but mostly we live with the memories of their kind words and deeds. What we have become is, at least in part, the result of their influence.

The gift of great teachers is cultivating lifelong learning. For me it was a passion for history, so thank you A.J. Drummond!


