

✓ Attendance affects a child's academic achievement and their overall wellbeing.

✓ There is NO safe threshold of absence – everyday counts.

✓ School attendance patterns are established early in a child's schooling – research shows Year 1 attendance is a predictor of future attendance patterns.

✓ The effects of school absenteeism accumulate over time and affect children's development now and into the future.

✓ Daily punctuality is important. The early part of each day is critical. Important learning is scheduled during this time when children are rested and receptive. Key concepts are built up in the time.

✓ Sporadic absences can affect academic achievement as much as absences over consecutive days.

✓ We **ALL** need to work together with our children's best interest in mind to ensure that students are at school every day that they are well enough to attend – they only get one go at this part of their education and **everyday counts**.

LENT

The church season on Lent begins in earnest tomorrow with **Ash Wednesday**. The school will hold a prayer liturgy during the day for our students. This year the distribution of ashes will be different due to COVID restrictions. It will mean that instead of the ashes being placed on each child's forehead they will be sprinkled over the head of the student. This is according to Diocesan directives issues for COVID. Ash Wednesday begins the liturgical season of Lent. Throughout Lent, we commit to strengthen our faith through prayer, reflection, fasting and giving. What is Lent all about? 
OPENING SCHOOL MASS


PARENT, STUDENT, TEACHER MEETINGS Kindergarten to Year 6

Swimming lessons for students in Years 1 to Years 6 will begin next week. This 5-day intensive compulsory swimming program will be conducted at the Aquatic Safety Training Academy in Seven Hills operated by Royal Life Saving, Australia's leading water safety educator.



Each grade will attend in a different week during Term 1. Each class will go at a different time during the day.

Year 1:	Term 2 Week 1,	April 19th - 23rd

The program caters for non-swimmers through to accomplished swimmers who will be able to gain experience in stroke techniques by participating in the coaching clinic.
