Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,

On Sunday we began the season of Advent. This is the first season of the church year and we now look to the Gospels of Matthew for enlightenment. There are four weeks in Advent as we await the birth(day) of Jesus at Christmas.



Waiting can often sap our energies and stifle our enthusiasm. Yet wait we must, and as we wait, we wonder: What should I be doing? The Gospels suggest we should wait with patient expectation for the day of reconciliation and peace; we should wait in joyful hope that what is to come will come soon.

What is it like to wait for God? Many of us know exactly what that is like. We wait for God to explain why a family member died too young. We wait for God to open a path out of a marriage that has ended, into a new place where healing might begin.

And of course, the last few years have been a time of waiting. We've waited during COVID and FLU outbreaks. We've waited on test results wondering whether we are positive or not.

Perhaps we are better equipped now than we ever have been to understand the often repeated Biblical mandate to 'wait for the coming of the Lord'.

Throughout November, we were also reminded by St. Ambrose to remember all who have died "that we have loved the departed during life; let us not abandon them in death."

Please keep in your prayers all who have died in your family and in our community so they too will be remembered, loved and cherished for eternity.




