Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,

We again come to the end of another busy term. Thank you to all our parents and carers for your continued support throughout the term. On behalf of the staff I would also like to thank you, our parents, for all the encouragement you give to your children as they come to school each day.

Dear Parents & Carers,

The school holidays are almost here, which means your child is about to have a lot of free time.Considering how much time we all spend in front of a screen these days, it's important to keep that balanced with some offline activities. Below is a compiled list of offline activities to help keep your child curious and learning during this period.

- *Board games*: You can stick with the classics including Monopoly, Chess, Scrabble and Jenga. Board games can help with developing your child's literacy and numeracy skills.
- *Have an indoor or garden picnic:* An indoor or outdoor picnic in your garden or local park will help to break the monotony of the routine and just add some fun and whimsy to meal times.
- Build a puzzle: This is an easy and simple way to keep little ones busy or even create an entire family activity.
- Teach your child to cook: Getting your child or teen to cook a few basic meals during the holiday for themselves or the family is a great life skill. It'll also help them feel a sense of accomplishment once they've successfully created a meal by themselves.
- *Go for a walk*: Getting out of the house and doing exercise in a safe way once a day is recommended for good health. A few times a week, go for a walk with the immediate family.



Withdrawal of a Student

A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/carer terminates the student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the student's enrolment is not given, the Parent/Carer is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. **One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment**.



At St. Michael's, we continue to promote student attendance. Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day. Regular school attendance plays a **critical role** in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities. When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.



FROM THE LIBRARY

Access to books for the holidays

You can always access our large collection of popular books to suit all ages and abilities via our eBook platforms. The ebooks, audio books, comics, and magazines are all free to read and can be accessed on any device anywhere in Australia or the world. If your child is going to use a tablet to read the books, you will need to download the apps from the app store. The apps are free as well.



Our <u>eLibrary</u> portal will be the easiest way to access Sora and Wheelers (our two eBook platforms). You will find videos that will guide you through the steps to access eBooks and audiobooks when you click on the links on the main page.

Below you will find a short explainer as well.

SORA Click on eBooks & audiobooks, then click on the link for Sora (Overdrive ACEN Collection)

The first time you access Sora on your device (any computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone) you will need to sign in. At the sign in page, click on the down arrow and then choose ACEN (Australian Catholic Education Network) as your school. Then click sign in. You will now be taken to the CEDP log-in page. Students will have to log in using their usernames and passwords that they use to access the internet at school. Once they verify their identity, they will be taken to the Sora site.



You will have to follow this process the first time you access Sora on any new device.

WHEELERS Click on eBooks & audiobooks, then click on the link for CEDP Wheelers eBooks.



You will find a sign-in button on the top right hand corner of the page. When you click on it, you will be taken to the CEDP login page. Students will have to log in using their usernames and passwords that they use to access the internet at school. Once they verify their identity, they will be able to borrow books to read or to listen to.

Highlights on Sora

We have recently added new books to our collection of **Always Available** books to over 400 eBooks and audiobooks. We have over 150 titles that are suitable for our primary school children. These are books that are always available to borrow and read. You do not have to worry about books being on loan and needing to wait before you can read them. Access the collection via this link

You must also check out our collection of over 500 <u>Read-Along</u> books on Sora. Read the book as you listen to it being read aloud to you. These are great books for our readers who want to become more confident in their reading.


