<u>ICAS</u>

At St. Michael's the students are given the opportunity to participate in the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS).

These are <u>NOT</u> compulsory but provide an opportunity for your child to gain a measure of their own achievement in an external assessment situation. All students who participate will receive their individual results and a certificate. Our school will also receive a comprehensive report on the overall results of each assessment.

This year, students in Years 3-6 are able to participate in the Mathematics and English Assessments. Both assessments are completed online and must be completed at school. Both assessments will take place before school in the School Library at <u>8am</u>. It is important that all students participating in the assessments arrive at school by this time.


Change to Whole School Assembly

At St. Michael's, we continue to promote student attendance. Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day. Regular school attendance plays a **critical role** in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities. When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.

Our target is for at least 90% attendance every day. To date, attendance for each grade is <u>well below our target</u>. However, across the Diocese this is the same trend due to the effects of COVID-19 and Influenza.

Our trend is improving and I wish to congratulate all students who have an attendance rate of at least 90%.

At the end of Term 3, students will be recognised with a special certificate that reflects their attendance in Term 3.



LATEST COVID-19 UPDATE LINK

Families at St Michael's continue to experience COVID cases, so it is important for you to monitor your children for symptoms and keep them at home if they are unwell. We will also contact you if your child feels unwell at school.

As it is flu season, please be vigilant about the early signs of influenza which also requires you to keep your children at home to ensure that we continue to maintain a healthy environment for the children and staff while at school.

COVID SAFE PROTOCOLS

All students, families and staff are requested to follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only transmitting COVID-19, but also other illnesses that may affect schools this winter such as the flu. Therefore we ask that students, staff and family members who visit the school to:

• inform the school if their child tests COVID positive and keep the child at home in isolation for the required 7 days.

• inform the school if their child is a close household contact, administer a RAT daily before the child attends school and keep the child home if they are unwell or symptomatic.

ROAD SAFETY - BE BUS AWARE



Slow down to 40km/h when bus lights flash

BUS FLASHING LIGHTS

All motorists MUST slow down to 40km/h when BUS LIGHTS FLASH. Drivers should look out for children who are crossing the road or waiting to cross. Lights flash on buses to warn motorists that buses are picking up and dropping off children. By law, a driver must not overtake or pass a bus with flashing lights at more than 40km/h.

Lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors open, and they keep flashing for about 20 seconds after the doors close. Children are most at risk in the minutes after they get off the bus.

Young children are often unpredictable in their movements. They

are still developing the skills that help them to judge the direction of sound and the speed and distance of vehicles. We know that because of their sheer size and mass, buses can cause severe outcomes for other road users in crashes.

Motorists can help reduce the risk of a crash and keep children safe by:

- \cdot Slowing down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing
- · Looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones or along bus routes
- · Giving way to buses when they merge back into traffic.


