



At St. Michael's, we continue to promote student attendance. Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day.

Our attendance has dropped back to 64% this fortnight, with a concerning number of students away in Year 2 and Year 3. Your child should be at school every school day until the end of the year, unless they are really sick and require a visit to the doctor where you can obtain a medical certificate.



Regular school attendance plays a **critical role** in ensuring your child has access to the same learning opportunities. When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.

YEAR 4 EXCURSION TO THE POWERHOUSE MUSEUM

On Friday 28th October two Year 4 classes went to the Powerhouse Museum at Ultimo. This excursion was to further explore and learn more about digital technology. The students were filled with excitement to go on their first excursion since Year One, thanks to lockdowns and restrictions the last few years.

The students learnt about using Scratch, a coding program. They were able to create their own simple video game. As well as this we explored some other great

exhibitions at the museum. We discovered the way scientists experiment with their thinking to discover great new things.

REFLECTION GARDEN FUNDRAISER
