URGENT INFORMATION ABOUT PRIME DRINKS

We are starting to have students bringing Prime drinks to school. We would like to inform parents of two things. Firstly these drinks are <u>not</u> to be brought to school. Secondly, there are a variety of flavours of drink, some of these are labelled as <u>not</u> <u>being suitable for children under the age of 15.</u>

There are two varieties, an energy drink and a hydration drink. The energy drink contains high levels of caffeine. A can of Prime contains 56 mg of caffeine, which is well above the maximum amount allowed in drinks in Australia of 32mg. This drink is being marketed differently to allow it to still be sold. This is labelled as not suitable for under 18.

The hydration drink contains high levels of additives which can have negative effects for growing children. Most of these are labelled as **not being suitable for children under the age of 15.**



We understand this drink is being marketed heavily to children through Youtubers. However we wanted to make sure you understand what is in this drink before making a choice for your children.

At St. Michael's, we continue to promote student attendance. Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day. Regular school attendance plays a critical role in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities. When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.

The following **Attendance Guidelines** are based on current legislative requirements, research on attendance and best

practice.

- ✓ Attendance affects a child's academic achievement and their overall wellbeing.
- ✓ There is NO safe threshold of absence everyday counts.
- ✓ School attendance patterns are established early in a child's schooling research shows Year 1 attendance is a predictor of future attendance patterns.
- ✓ The effects of school absenteeism accumulate over time and affect children's development now and into the future.
- ✓ Daily punctuality is important. The early part of each day is critical. Important learning is scheduled during this time when children are rested and receptive. Key concepts are built up in the time.
- ✓ Sporadic absences can affect academic achievement as much as absences over consecutive days.
- ✓ We ALL need to work together with our children's best interest in mind to ensure that students are at school every day that they are well enough to attend they only get one go at this part of their education and everyday counts.




