We acknowledge the Darug people, the traditional custodians on whose land we educate our students.

Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends,

Today we celebrate the feast of St. Valentine. The event has become so commercialised that the word 'saint' has disappeared. Not only has St Valentine's day been captured by commercial interests (think roses, chocolates, jewellery, restaurants, movies and endless bric-a-brac), it's also been hijacked for relationships that don't even have romance as a feature.



But it's not just about keeping the saint in the day and resisting the secularisation of yet another Christian feast day. It's also about promoting the unique role that marriage plays in our church and in society. St Valentine, a Roman bishop, was martyred for conducting secret weddings against the decree of Emperor Claudius II (269 AD). He so valued marriage he was willing to give his life defending it. St Valentine was not alone among the martyrs for marriage: St John the Baptist, St Thomas More, St John Fisher and Blessed Peter To Rot all remind us that following Christ's understanding comes with a cost.



St Valentine, and these other martyrs, understood that marriage was not some social construct, but rather was fundamentally important to the idea that God's love for humanity was revealed through marriage and was something worth dying for.

I am so proud of how beautifully the children have continued to transition to the new school year - especially since the school looks like a construction zone. Congratulations to the staff who have guided their students and helped them to become so focused on and eager about their learning. Our Year 6 students have been amazing by supporting our Kindies as they arrive in the mornings and as they play at recess and lunchtime. As a result of the preparation that parents and teachers have provided, our Kindergarten children are settling in and are already part of the St Michael's community.

Our beautiful beginning School Mass celebrated on Friday was a true testament to our faith-filled community. Our priest Father Ever reminded us of the meaning of love. He also blessed our newly commissioned Year 6 leaders and Student Council Representatives. I thank the many parents and friends that joined us for this special occasion.

Yesterday the builders finished replacing the Infants building roof with Colorbond. They also replaced the gutters and downpipes. Tomorrow they begin work on the Administration block. Please be aware of the restricted parking in the staff car park this week.

Additionally, some events permit the school to send a limited number of students to the trial. This is a limit that has been placed on all schools across the diocese. Please note that all decisions made are in consultation with leadership across the school, as well as the CSPD Primary Sport Conveners.

All parents will be notified of their child's registration outcome as soon as possible. Those students who are successful will be provided permission notes closer to the trial date when they are provided to the school.

PARENT VOLUNTEER MODULE

Throughout the school year, St. Michael's Primary School participates in a number of sporting events that often require parents to volunteer and support our school. It is a requirement for these volunteers to complete a Child Protection module which stays current for two years upon completion.
