Dear Parents & Carers,

Learning Goals

Personal learning goals are about improving students' learning and achievement and building students' capacity to learn. They are about students becoming active participants in the learning process, empowering them to become independent learners, and motivating them to achieve their full potential.



Previous research into the motivation and efficiency of students has indicated that students who set their own working goals tend to achieve more than when working on goals set for them by the teacher. Students who set their own learning goals have more confidence to take on more challenging tasks, regardless of their ability. Their motivation to improve and master a task is improved and their self-esteem remains strong, even in the case of failure.

On Friday you would have received your child's goals. Please ensure you have discussed and continue to check in with your child about their learning goals and how they are going with them. Recognising your child's achievements with their goals can go a long way to encouraging a positive mindset about school and their learning.

If you have any questions or require further clarification regarding your child's learning goals, please contact your child's classroom teacher.

NAPLAN

The official NAPLAN testing period for Years 3 & 5 is scheduled between **15th and 27th March.** Teachers will be preparing students for NAPLAN by making them familiar with the type of questions and tools they will experience during the tests by using the demonstration site. Parents are welcome to access the public demonstration site as well to understand what the different NAPLAN assessments involve. All Year 3 & Year 5 students will require headphones for the practice tests. Most students at St. Michael's already have these. Please make sure your child has working headphones. These cannot be the bluetooth or earbud type.

PROJECT COMPASSION LENT WEEK 2

Tereesa is a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying for a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.



Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

GOSSIP

From time to time when people come together, some find the need to talk about others and pass on tales whether true or not that can hurt, defame or disrespect. Our Catholic faith instructs us to 'not bear false witness against our neighbour.' Aside from the inappropriateness of gossip and slander is the hurt that it causes to people's reputations, esteem and feelings. Teachers, parents, children and our community should not be damaged by the whispers of gossip. If we are truly building the Kingdom of God here at St. Michael's, we should think before we talk and choose our words based on the Gospel values. After all, this is what we are trying to teach our children

ATTENDANCE - EVERY LEARNER - EVERY DAY

The following *Attendance Guidelines* are based on current legislative requirements, research on attendance and best practice.

- · Attendance affects a child's academic achievement and their overall wellbeing.
- There is NO safe threshold of absence every day counts.
- School attendance patterns are established early in a child's schooling research shows Year 1 attendance is a predictor of future attendance patterns.
- The effects of school absenteeism accumulate over time and affect children's development now and into the future.
- Daily punctuality is important. The early part of each day is critical. Important learning is scheduled during this time when children are rested and receptive. Key concepts are built up in the time.
- Sporadic absences can affect academic achievement as much as absences over consecutive days.
- We ALL need to work together with our children's best interest in mind to ensure that students are
 at school every day that they are well enough to attend they only get one go at this part of their
 education and every day counts.

Below is a table showing the thresholds established Student across the Diocese for student attendance and the Absence accumulated effects over 10 years of school time lost. Attendance Rate Educational Days absent per Risk year Cumulative Absence over 10 years of school

90% or more	Regular	Low or zero	20 days or less	Adds up to 1 year or less schooling missed
80% - 89%	Emerging	Medium	Between 20 - 40 days	Adds up to 1-2 years schooling missed
70% - 79%	Chronic	High	Between 40-60 days	Adds up to 2-3 years schooling missed
69% or lower	Complex	Severe	60 or more days	Adds up to 3 years plus schooling missed

Year 4 Excursion to Kamay Botany Bay National Park

On Friday, Year 4 travelled to Kamay Botany Bay National Park. They travelled back in time to explore the natural bush filled with natural resources that Australia's First Nations peoples used, as well as the location of the arrival of Captain James Cook. The students had a fun-filled day with lots of bushwalking to explore the different aspects of the park. These included observing a vast variety of trees, plants and insect life. They even built their own Gunyah (huts) using the natural resources they could find in the bushland.

The students learnt about the arrival of Captain James Cook as well as his travelling companions, botanist Sir Joseph Banks, and naturalist Daniel Solandar. The students learnt about how these men were in awe of the natural beauty of Australia and its unique native animals.

The students also got to see the sculptures placed at Botany Bay to commemorate the first interactions between Captain Cook and the First Nations people. The whale has cultural significance to the First Nations peoples of the Sydney area, and the canoes symbolising the traditional stringy bark canoes used by fisher people at the time of Captain Cook's arrival.

Premier's Reading Challenge 2022



The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is an initiative by all the state governments in Australia. The aim of the PRC is to reignite the love of reading in our children. It is not a competition to see who finishes first. Children are encouraged to read, read more books, and read books that might be different to what they would usually read.

The challenge requires children to read a set number of books depending on their grade. Children can borrow books from the school library or your local public library to read as part of their Challenge. Parents and carers are not expected to purchase books for their children to read for the PRC.

Last year 64 children completed the challenge. We are looking forward to many more children joining the challenge and completing it this year.

You could register your child online via this <u>form</u>. Paper registration forms will be sent out to classes over the next couple of days. Please remember that you need to register your child/children only once.

Book Club

Thank you to everyone who has placed their orders via Loop or has sent in their orders to school. I will be finalising the orders today. All orders will be collated at Scholastic and sent to school. Once they arrive at school, the books will be sent to your child's classroom.
